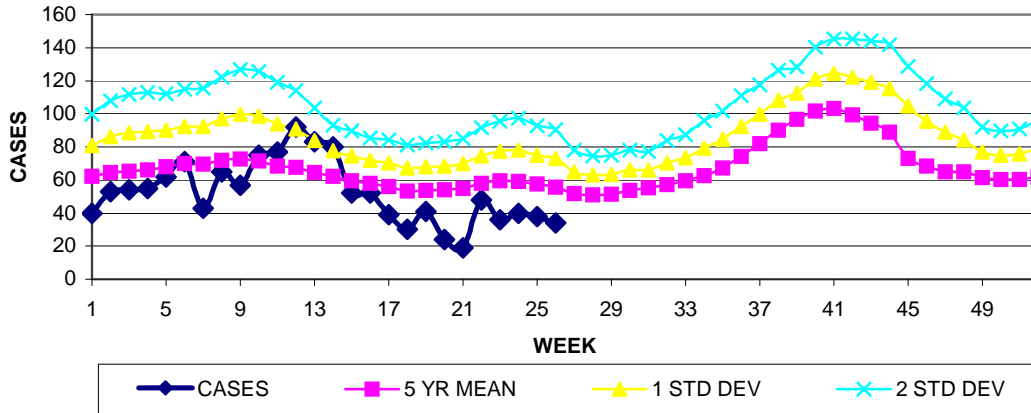


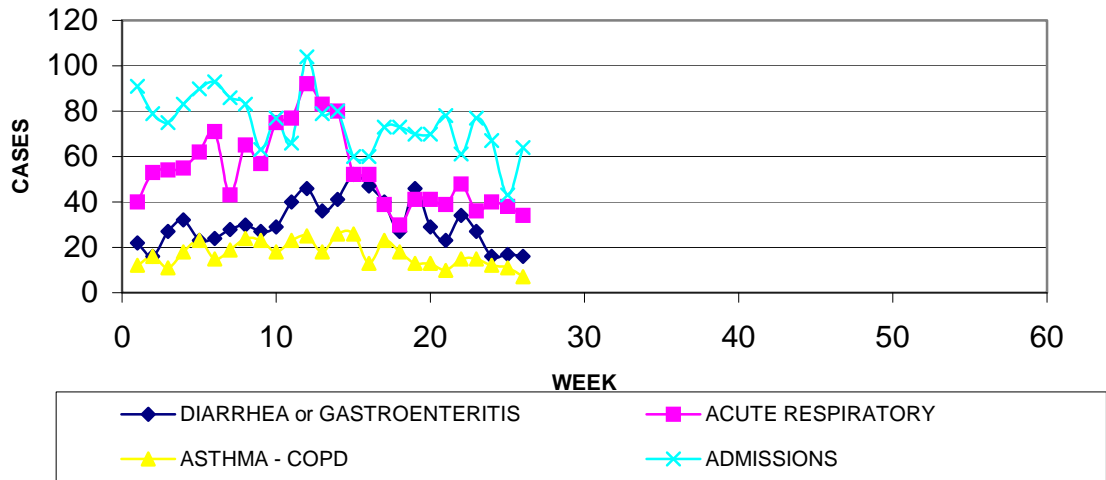

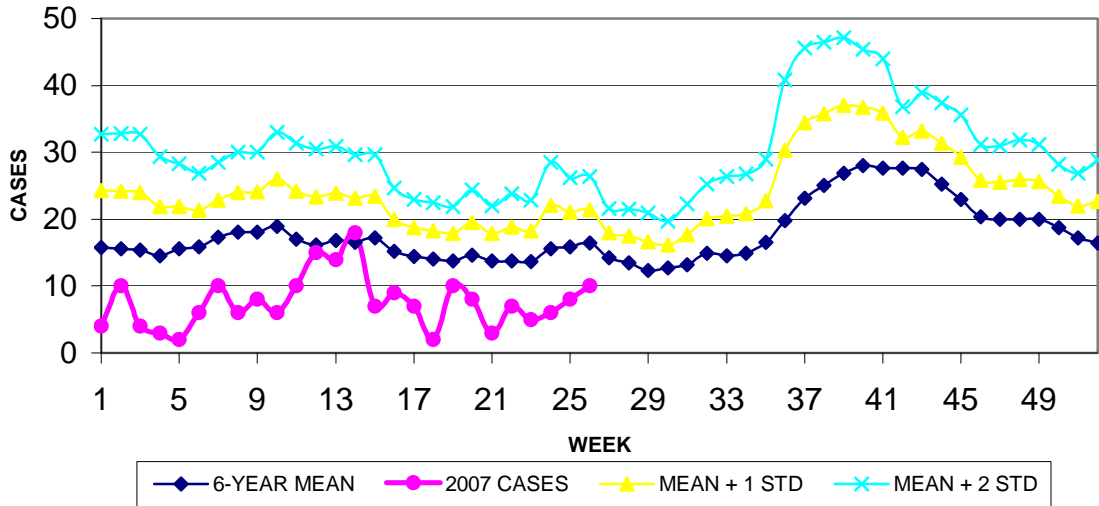
**GUAM ACUTE RESPIRATORY INFECTION SURVEILLANCE, 2007;
 NUMBER OF PATIENTS SEEN IN THE GMHA-ED BY WEEK SEEN**



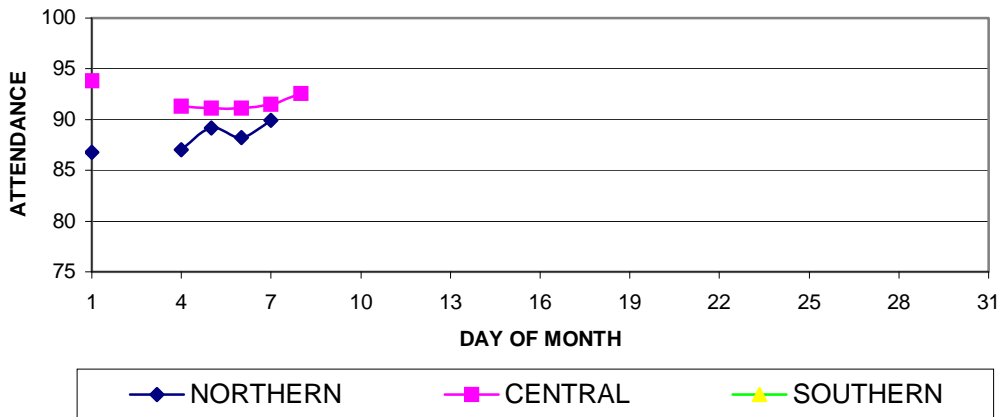
**GUAM SYNDROMIC DISEASE SURVEILLANCE

 2007**



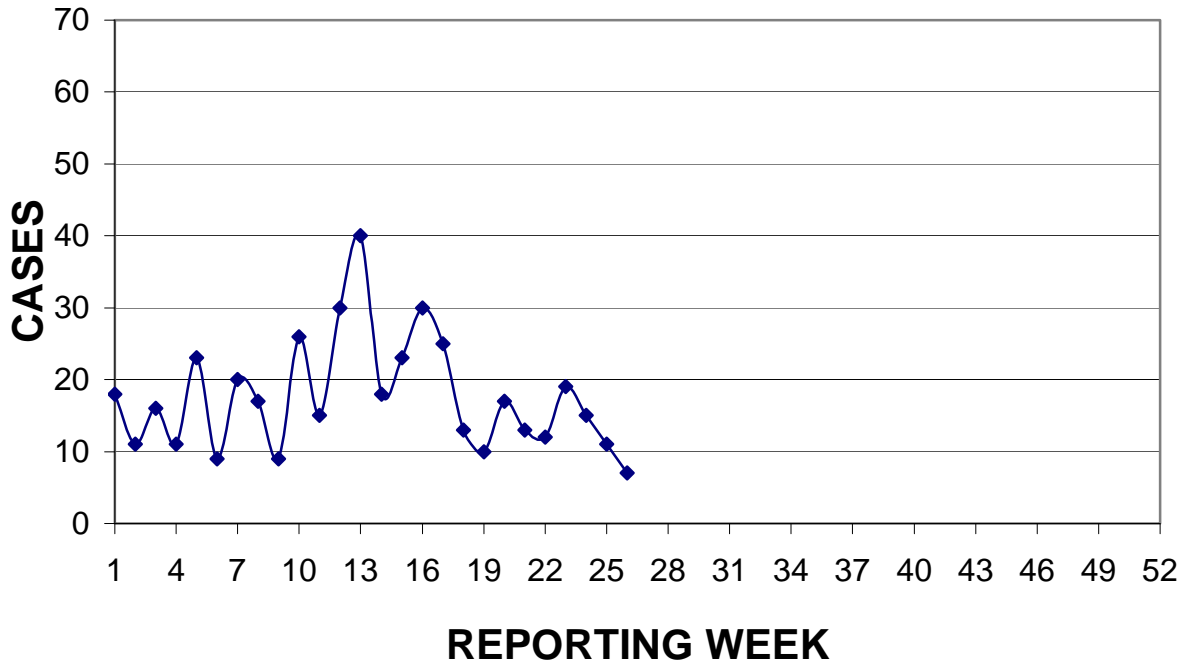

ZIKA VIRUS UPDATE - As of 7/2/07 no additional probable cases of Zika virus infection have been reported on Guam. Case definition remains sudden onset of at least two of the following symptoms: conjunctivitis, macular popular rash, or arthralgia/arthritis. Joint pains, if present, may be accompanied by swelling. Fever may or may not be present. Health care providers are asked to immediately report any suspect cases to Public Health at 735-7134 or 888-WARN.
