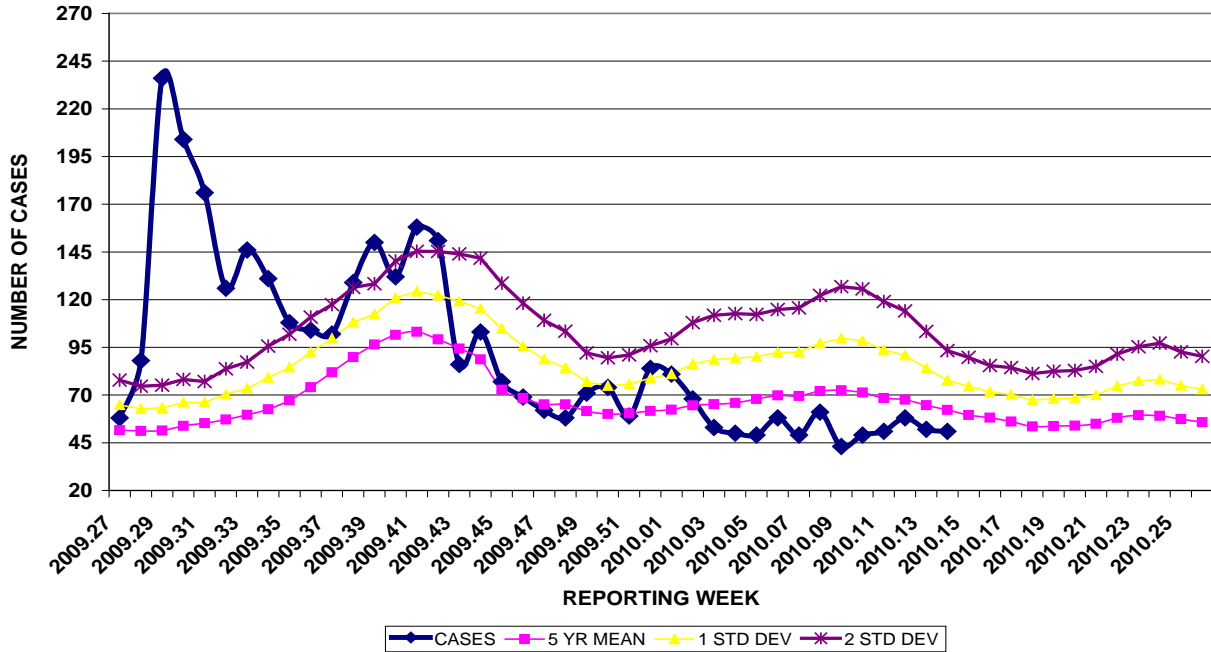


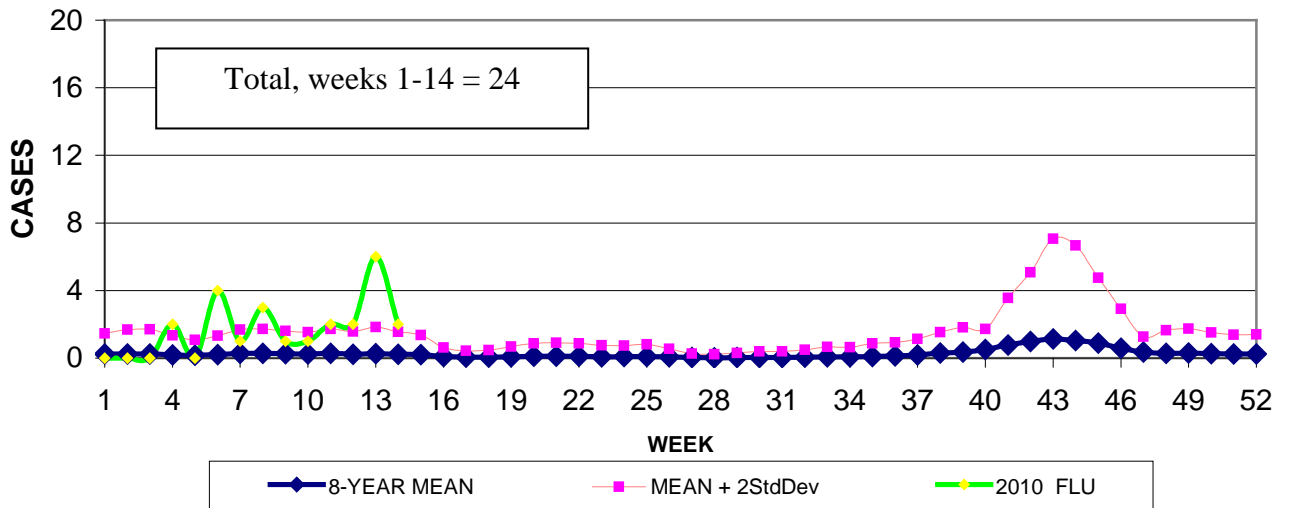

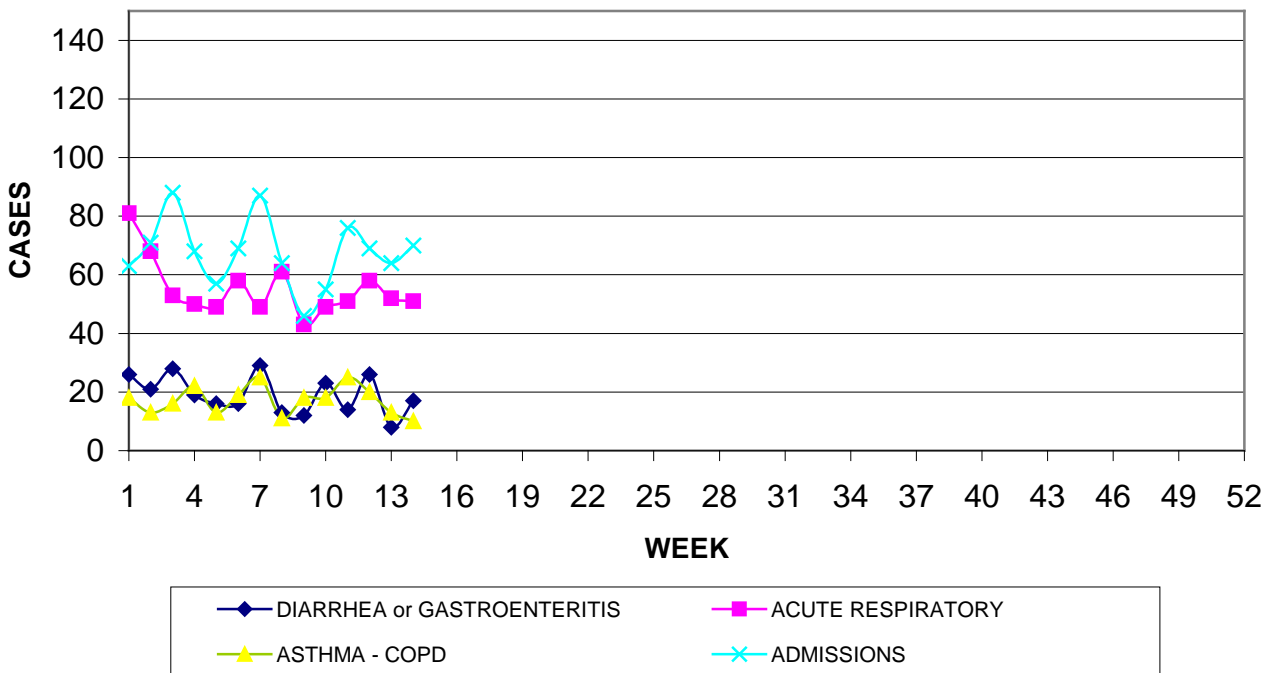
**GUAM ACUTE RESPIRATORY INFECTION SURVEILLANCE, 2009-2010  
 NUMBER OF PATIENTS SEEN IN GMHA-ED BY WEEK SEEN**



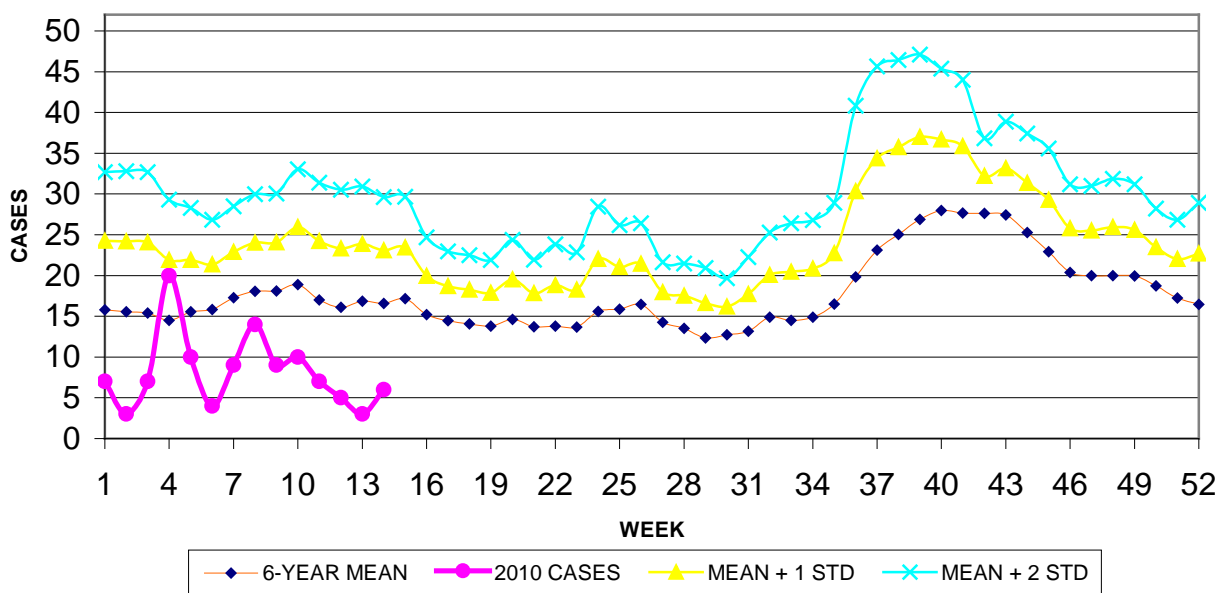
**2010 INFLUENZA AND FLU-LIKE ILLNESSES BY WEEK SEEN,

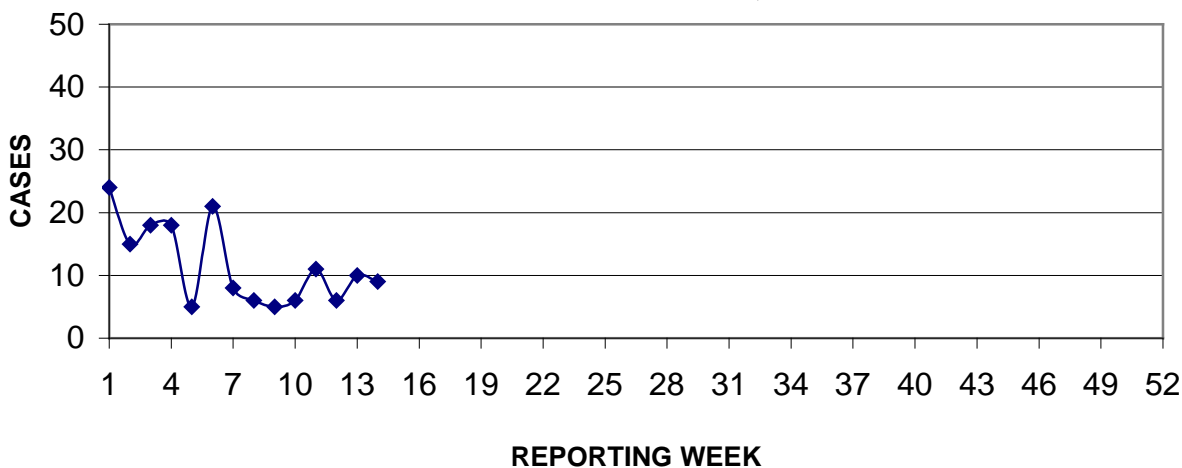

**GUAM MUMPS ADVISORY**

The Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services reports that the number of laboratory-confirmed cases of mumps identified in recent weeks now totals 17, an additional 49 cases are classified as suspect or probable and are under investigation. Confirmed cases have so far been concentrated in the northern part of the island. One case has been identified in a visitor from Japan but this case occurred over a month after the present outbreak started and could not be the original source of infection.

Physicians seeing children and teens are requested to routinely review their vaccination records. In case you do not have a convenient form for this purpose, one is attached.

**REGIONAL UPDATES - BALI**

The “yearly dengue fever outbreak” claimed the lives of two children last week in Bali. The victims, a 4-year-old and an 11-year-old, were being treated for dengue shock syndrome. The total number of cases and fatalities for the year was not disclosed.
