Evolution of number of cases for the 8 selected syndromes, for **Tuesday September 3rd**

Participating sites for Tuesday the 3rd: Three dispensaries in Wallis and one dispensary in Futuna reporting. All the six temporary sentinel sites set up specifically for the Mini Games are now fully operational for surveillance reporting. All 10 sites planned to report during the Mini Games are thus currently reporting.

- **Acute Fever & Rash:** No cases observed.
- **Watery Diarrhoea:** No cases observed.
- **Non-Watery Diarrhoea:** No cases observed.
- **Influenza-like-illness:** 3 cases observed at Hahake.
- **Prolonged Fever:** 1 case from Wallis and Futuna observed at Urgence Sia and is being further followed-up.
- **Acute Fever & Neurological symptoms:** No cases observed.
- **Food borne disease outbreak:** No cases observed.
- **Heat-related-illness:** 2 cases observed at Stade Kafika and 1 at Urgence Sia.

A sanitary inspection has been conducted at one of the delegate residences, resulting in recommendations for food handlers including use of gloves and other protective gear.

Conclusion/recommendations:

- All reporting sites set up for the Mini Games are now operational. Patients seen at sentinel reporting sites have increased during the first week of surveillance from n=96 on Monday 26 of August to n=190 in today's report (see Graph 1 below)
- The initial observed slight increase in influenza like illness (ILI) has not been sustained (see Graph 2 below), but NPS was taken for one of the ILI cases and is being followed-up.
- Smears and rapid tests for malaria were negative on the case of Prolonged Fever from Papua New Guinea. Further investigation is ongoing, including: dengue fever, chikungunya and

leptospirosis infections. There are currently no reported secondary cases of prolonged fever having been in contact with the case.

- The case of Acute Fever and Rash from French Polynesia reported on the 2nd of September was a misreported case of ear infection with fever.
- After the initial case of non watery diarrhoea, there have been no further cases of non watery diarrhoea and still no clusters of diarrhoea observed (see Graph 2 below), hence there is no further investigation planned at this stage.
