A/ Evolution of number of cases for the 8 selected syndromes, for **Wednesday September 11th**

Participating sites for Wednesday September 11th: Three dispensaries in Wallis and one dispensary in Futuna reporting. All the six temporary sentinel sites set up specifically for the Mini Games are now (04092013) fully operational for surveillance reporting. All 10 sites planned to report during the Mini Games are thus currently reporting.

During the weekend of the games, reports for 6 (Ecole Futuna, Kaveleve, Ecole Malateoli, Collège Lano, Lycee d'Etat and Urgence Sia) of the 10 sentinel sites reported.

- **Acute Fever & Rash:** No cases reported.
- **Watery Diarrhoea:** No cases reported.
- **Non-Watery Diarrhoea:** 1 child from Wallis and Futuna reported.
- **Influenza-like-illness:** No cases reported.
- **Prolonged Fever:** No cases reported.
- **Acute Fever & Neurological symptoms:** No cases reported.
- **Food borne disease outbreak:** 5 cases reported from a village in Wallis and Futuna.
- **Heat-related-illness:** No cases reported.

All reporting sites set up for the Mini Games are now operational. Patients seen at sentinel reporting sites are increasing since the start of surveillance. Reporting during Saturday and Sundays were done from fewer sites, since several clinics were not be open (see Graph 1 below).

Following a notification of a sanitary breach at one of the canteens of the delegations, the EpiNet team of Wallis and Futuna started sanitary investigations 05092013 in three canteens of the delegations. A meeting between the Agence de Sante, SPC and BIVAP the agency responsible for addressing sanitation in catering facilities discussed the actions recommended for the Lycee d'état restaurant. The Agence de Sante takes on the responsibility of screening of all food handlers and analysing of samples taken during the examinations.

Conclusion/recommendations:

- Despite an overall increase in patient visits to the sentinel sites, the percentage of patients reported with one or more syndromes is stable and low (see Graph 1 below)
- The food borne disease outbreak reported 12092013 from MUA has been followed up. 5 people from the same village got ill 08092013 and the likely source was a salad during a village feast. The doctor at MUA dispensary pursue if there are further cases. The case of food borne disease notified 06092013 at Urgence Sia has been further followed up, and it was described as an isolated case of food poisoning resulting from lead (gun bullet) in pork meat. This is the only case reported as of 10092013.
- The 3 cases of watery diarrhoea notified 10092013 should be further followed up. The 2 cases of watery diarrhoea notified at Hahake 07092013 and 06092013 have been followed up 10092013, patients were asymptomatic at investigation and no stool sample taken. Previous information of a stool sample for the watery diarrhoea case from the emergency ward of the main Hospital SIA (notified 05092013) was erroneous. There have been no reports of linked cases of watery diarrhoea neither to this case nor to the watery diarrhoea case at Mua (notified 05092013). No further follow up is currently recommended for these cases (10092013). There are two more cases of watery diarrhoea notified 09092013. These are being followed up and case definitions reviewed.
- No further follow-up currently recommended for the 4 cases notified 10092013 and the 6 cases of influenza like illness (ILI) notified 09092013. The ILI cases notified on 08092013 at Urgence Sia are being followed up with laboratory tests. There has been reported a clustering of influenza-like illness (ILI) in the Tongan contingent 07092013. Further investigation was be done on Monday 09092013, including NPS sample taken for transport to reference laboratory (IPNC, Noumea) for analysis. There is an increase in the number of in (ILI) notified 06092013. This also includes the patient with prolonged fever notified 06092013. The initial observed slight increase in ILI starting 26082013 was not sustained (See Graph 2 below). Samples from 06092013 were analysed at IPNC and reported negative in PCR for influenza by 12092013.
- The case of prolonged fever notified from Urgence Sia 03092013 was further followed up and reported to have flu like symptoms. The case of prolonged fever from Urgence Sia on 07092013 has been followed up and been classified as a common cold, with no further recommendation for follow up.
- Smears and rapid tests for malaria were negative on the case of Prolonged Fever from Papua New Guinea (notified 02092013). Further investigation showed IgM positivity for leptospirosis, which is a specific analysis confirming Leptospirosis infection. The patient is now well, receiving treatment from the PNG delegation medical staff and there are no additional cases from the PNG delegation or other delegations (05092013). The patient could not likely have been infected in Wallis & Futuna, considering that the date of onset of symptoms was 28082013 and the patient arrived to Wallis & Futuna 31082013.
- 1 case of non-watery diarrhoea notified 12092013. 2 cases of non-watery diarrhoea notified 06092013. There was 1 new case of non-watery diarrhoea observed at the sentinel site in Futuna (notified 05092013). No clusters of diarrhoea observed (See Graph 2 below), no further investigation is planned at this stage.
