

DEN-1 Outbreak in the Pacific — Update as at 22 May 2002

The DEN-1 outbreak which has been affecting the region for the past 18 months is not over yet. Half of the Pacific Island countries and territories have been involved. The chart below shows the information we have on hand about this outbreak by country/territory and in chronological order of appearance.

Certain other countries and territories in the region have been affected by this outbreak.

Hawaii recorded its first cases of dengue fever in June 2001 and reported 119 confirmed cases as of 5 April 2002.¹

More recently, a new DEN-1 focus appeared on Easter Island in early February 2002. As at 5 April 2002, the estimated number of cases was 360, including 57 confirmed cases.²

Finally, Australia experienced some cases of DEN-1 in Townsville (Queensland) in April 2002.³
